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ALL EVENTS TICKETS (AETs), SINGLE EVENT TICKETS (SETs), AND CLUB 21 TICKETS

PICK UP YOUR BADGES (AETS): Name badges can be picked up at the Registration table located on the second floor of The Clyde Hotel (within the Boutique). *You will not be allowed to pick up someone else's AET*. Registration & Ticket Sales hours are located in the Schedule of Events at the end of this bulletin.

ALL EVENTS TICKETS (AETs): AETs can be purchased on-site at the Registration table with credit card, check, or cash. Reminder – all registration fees (AETs) are transferable, but not refundable.

AET Costs: \$115.00 (Adult), and \$72.50 (Youth-25 years or under).

SINGLE EVENT TICKETS (SETs): SETs for the quartet or chorus contests can be purchased on-site at the Registration table with credit card, check, or cash. SET holders may present their printed or digital ticket at the Registration table or at the door, and will be given a wristband that allows them to enter and leave freely throughout the day of competition.

SET Costs Per Event: \$45.00 (Adult) and \$22.50 (Youth-25 years or under).

CLUB 21 TICKETS: Tickets to Club 21 will be available at the door for \$5 each (cash or check please). If you pre-purchased your tickets, bring your printed or digital ticket/receipt with you to the door.

CONTEST SEATING is general admission/open seating, except for VIP seating, and available on a first-come, first-served basis.

VIP SEATING: The following VIP categories are entitled to purchase AETs with VIP seating: International Faculty Members, International Board of Directors, International Past Presidents, International Quartet Champions, Current Rising Star Champions, International Judging Program Members, Current Regional Management Team (RMT) from all Regions of SAI, Current Regional Convention Steering Committee (RCSC) Members, Front Line Chorus Directors, Current/Outgoing Region 21 Quartet Champions, Quartets scoring in the top 15 at 2022 International Convention, Region 21 Hall of Fame Recipients, Certified Arrangers, and any RMT-designated special guest not listed above, e.g., local media, city officials, etc. VIPs and all VIP Guests must purchase an AET. **VIPs will be entitled to one VIP seat for themselves, and one for a pre-designated guest**. The guest must be named as a VIP GUEST on the registration forms. VIPs will not be able to add a guest on site. A VIP designation will be indicated on the AET badge. *A VIP is only eligible for <u>one seat and one guest seat</u> regardless of the number of areas in which they are eligible.*

HOTEL ROOM RATES, RESERVATIONS, PARKING & TRANSPORTATION

Hotel registration for competitors is now closed. Chorus and quartet room reservations have been submitted to The Clyde Hotel, and reservation numbers have been sent back to each registered chorus and quartet. NON-COMPETITOR ROOM RESERVATIONS: Chapter-at-Large and guests of Region 21 ONLY, who wish to register as individuals, may make your hotel reservations by calling The Clyde Hotel directly at (505) 302-6930 and asking for the Sweet Adelines Competition group rate.

FACILITY USAGE FEE: A fee of \$80 IS STILL REQUIRED for any competing member who does not stay a minimum of one night in the convention hotel. This assessment applies to all members of a Region 21 competing chorus, quartet, and the Assistance Chapter. Facility usage fees need to be paid online at https://www.region21.org/regional-contest.

This notification may come by email, but a phone call is not sufficient. Should you need to withdraw on competition weekend, please notify the Competition Coordinator, Lou Gordon. JOINT COMPETITION INSPECTION: (Directors and Quartets only) will be **Friday March 17th from 9:00 am - 10:00** am in the Pavilion Ballroom. Directors are invited to listen to the Friday morning sound check with the Assistance Chorus.

QUARTET WALK ON AND EMCEE ROLL CALL: Quartets will have an opportunity to do their walk-on, acceptance, take a pitch, sing a short intro or tag of not more than 10 seconds, take a bow, and walk-off on **Friday, March 17th from 10:00 am to 10:45 am** in the Pavilion Ballroom. The emcee will be present for your introduction.

EDUCATION CLASS: On **Friday, March 17th from 11:00 am to 12:00 pm,** you won't want to miss *Singing Through Change: Women's Voices in Midlife, Menopause, and Beyond,* presented by Nancy Bos in the Whyte Room. (See p.9 for details)

QUARTET COMPETITION: The quartet competition will be held on **Friday, March 17, 2023** and is slated to begin at 2:00 pm and end at approximately 6:00 pm (schedule subject to change). Plan your day accordingly so you don't miss a minute of our very special Region 21 quartets!

- **Traffic Pattern & Hosts:** We will not have individual quartet and chorus hosts this year. We will have people directing choruses and quartets through the traffic pattern, but not one host per chorus. **Patterns** have been approved by the Panel Chair and been sent to all competitors. Changes will be based on withdrawals only.
- **DO NOT bring purses and shoes to the pattern.** Since the competition is being held in the hotel, anything you need later can be left in your room and retrieved once you're done competing. Each quartet may have one quart-sized bag for any medical necessities (such as inhalers or epi-pens).
- **Quartets:** You will meet in the Atrium Lobby on the first floor. From there you will be directed to the photo room by a host from the Assistance Chapter. After your photo, you will be directed to the warm-up room, taken backstage, and then brought to the ballroom when you are finished competing. If you have a member that is unable to do steps a dedicated elevator will be provided and your host will direct you to it.
- **Photos:** If you did not already turn in your photo order form during the Joint Briefing, bring it to give to the photographer in the photo room. (See Photos and Digital Recordings page for more info.)
- **The Stage:** Staging and lighting are uniform for all contestants. Quartet monitors will be used. All contestants are required to leave the stage in the condition they found it. The penalty for a violation is 25 points.
- **Props**: No penalty is attached to the use of props or visual devices in any Regional or International contest session. The degree to which such use enhances or detracts from the performance is reflected in the Visual Communication score. All props and visual devices must enter and leave the performance venue with the chorus or quartet. Storage space for any props or equipment, other than riser chairs or medically necessary items, is not provided by the contest venue.

SCORE SHEETS: Pick up score sheets immediately after the conclusion of each contest at the Panel Secretary table in the Pavilion Ballroom. Packets may be picked up by ONLY one quartet member, and for choruses, ONLY by the Team Coordinator, Chapter President, or Director.

FRIDAY EDUCATION CLASS DETAILS

EDUCATION CLASS: On Friday morning, March 17th from 11:00 am to 12:00 pm, you won't want to miss *Singing Through Change: Women's Voices in Midlife, Menopause, and Beyond,* presented by Nancy Bos in the Whyte Room.

Women's voices change as they age and go through perimenopause, menopause and then aging voice issues. For singers, this can have many profound effects. In this talk, based on the best-selling book *Singing Through Change* co-written by Nancy, Joanne Bozeman, and Cate Frazier-Neely, Nancy will expose us to challenges singers face and give us solutions for working through them. Issues can include a wide range of physical and emotional challenges, and vary from singer to singer. Strategies will include consideration of the effects of hormone changes, the impact of self-care, medical intervention, the need for flexibility from the singers, and flexibility from those who support them.

Nancy Bos's message of *a better life through freeing your voice* has been heard around the world. A voice coach and TEDx speaker, she has written three best-selling books. Nancy is also a professional singer in a variety of genres, keynote speaker, and thought leader. She taught singing for 24 years and is the founder of StudioBos Media (publishing). Her work is guided by the philosophy that singing makes people happier, healthier, more peaceful, and thoughtful. For more information, please visit <u>nancybos.me</u>.

QUARTET PHOTOS: Quartet photos will be taken in the traffic pattern at The Clyde Hotel. You should know which pose you want, or the photographer can help with some ideas or modifications. A variety of pictures will be taken; you'll view the pictures on a monitor and select your favorite at that time. Please note that time in the photo room is limited.

CHORUS PHOTOS: Chorus photos will be taken in the traffic pattern at The Clyde Hotel. Chorus Directors and Choreographers will be given the opportunity to see the setup in the Photo Room after the briefing Thursday evening or after the Judges Inspection so they can plan a pose. On Saturday, in the Photo Room, the photographer will take 4 pictures of each chorus. The photographer will select the best photograph of the 4.

A reminder that NO photographs or videos are allowed from any audience member during the competition, unless authorized by Sweet Adelines International. There is also a very strict "no photography" policy in the quartet photo room - no photos are to be taken by anyone other than Freeze Frame Photography.
